

Centennial Ideas

Perform a historical pageant (script and ideas will be on website)

Do a PTA day at the local athletic event, rodeo, zoo, park, amusement park, museum, pool, etc

PTA History day at school

Have a social function (IE cake and ice cream) at city hall with a Local leader

Do a wetlands project

Include centennial in scrapbook

Send out Press releases to local radio, TV, and newspapers (get boilerplate language from Texas PTA, will be on website soon)

Get a proclamation from your mayor, superintendent (see sample language on Texas PTA website soon) and send a press release about it

Have a PTA exhibit at your local library or museum

Have a float at a parade

Have a booth at a community event – rodeo, arts fair and distribute the centennial information tri-fold (get from PTA office in 2009)

Participate in a centennial party

Do a time capsule

Plant a tree on campus or in a park

Install a bench on campus or in a park

Put a commemorative plaque next to your tree or bench

Publish historical milestones in your newsletter

If at a Middle or High School, encourage the student paper to run a piece on your centennial

Create a Public Service Announcement for your community radio, TV, or newspaper.

Dedicate a book in the library

Have a PTA history trivia night

Show the PTA history video

Present PTA history at a meeting of a local club (Rotarians, etc)

Rediscover your life members. Invite them to a dinner in their honor.

Bring a past president for show and tell

Have a fashion show highlighting fashions from the past 100 years

Have a contest to write a poem or song about what PTA means to them

Have someone sing the PTA song at an event
