4. Although we don't want you to reinvent the wheel, there is always room for improvement, we need you to share what has worked for you and what has not. We want your fresh ideas.

5. As they say in Boy Scout "every boy deserves a trained leader" well, every child and every school deserve a great and well trained PTA.

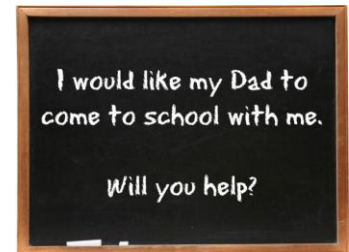

Money Matters Moment

How to determine if your PTA is in good standing with the IRS

Before filing the PTA's current 2010-2011 tax return, verify that the previous tax returns were filed. Visit the following website to find and view a PTA's e-postcard: <http://www.irs.gov/app/ePostcard/>

Hint: The quickest and easiest way to perform the search is to enter the 9 digit Employment Identification Number (E.I.N.) and then hit enter.

If the initial search above turned up no results, you may visit <http://www.guidestar.org> using the EIN to do a search for the PTA's past 990 or 990-EZ filings. If you are unsuccessful in locating prior year returns, then a phone call should be placed to the IRS Exempt Organization Customer Service toll-free number 1-877-829-5500. If you find that no tax returns exist, then the IRS may have revoked the PTA's nonprofit status. Contracts

In the course of a year, a PTA may enter into a variety of contracts. For instance, a PTA may contract for a band for a dance or purchase supplies for a fundraising venture. The PTA assumes the responsibility to comply with the terms and conditions of the contract and to pay the stated sum. The fact that an activity is not a financial success or that the PTA has insufficient funds to meet its obligation has no effect on the responsibility assumed.

Before you enter into a contract on behalf of your PTA, consider the following:

- *Has the membership approved the project?*
- *Does the president have authorization from the board to negotiate a contract?*
- *Have all contracts been received in writing?*
- *Are the terms and conditions of the contract understood? Have they been reviewed by legal counsel, if needed, and agreed to by the board?*
- *Is the length of the contract limited to the term of the participating officers, and does it not encumber future boards?*

When entering into a contract, the PTA president is responsible for the agreement and should clearly identify that it is the PTA entering into the contract and not the president as an individual. The signature on a written contract should read, "_____ PTA (or PTSA or council) by: John Doe, President."

Contract Tip

Remember, if there is any question about the terms or conditions of the contract, the proper time to seek advice is **before** the contract is signed.

IMPORTANT information about making PTA Deposits

Last year, a local PTA in Area 16 had a Back to School Bash, and as we PTAs do, they stayed after to count the money and prepare the deposit. When they left the school, there was a car in the parking lot that was apparently waiting for them to leave with the money. The car followed them until the president drove to the police station. While this was quite scary for them, they are fine. They were good enough to share the experience

Please consider this reminder about money and safety.

- Do not leave your school alone, especially at night! The more the merrier!
- When carrying a bank deposit, don't have the bags in plain sight. Put them into your purse or a solid tote bag so that it is not obvious you are carrying money.
- If possible, don't have your children in the car with you when taking a large deposit to the bank. While this often can't be avoided, play it safe when you can.
- If you know you will be counting a large deposit at night and have concerns about your safety, try calling your police department the morning of the event and asking for a courtesy escort to the bank.

If you have any concerns for your safety and it is late, ask the principal if they can lock the money in their vault and that you will return first thing in the morning to take it to the bank. Personal safety is way more important than making a deposit immediately



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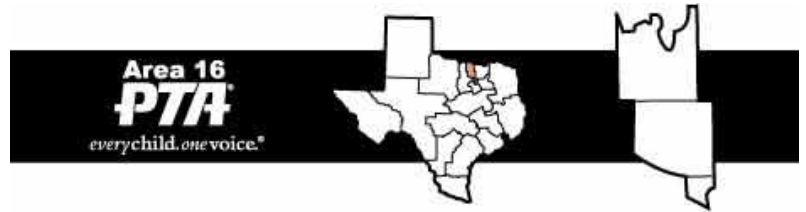
