Youth Code Jam Grant

What you'll need to be successful:

- Support from the school administration and teachers.
- Access to a copy machine to make copies of provided station activities.
- Access to craft supplies including scissors, crayons, markers, colored pencils, and tape.
- Attend the two training webinars and reach out to Youth Code Jam for additional support.
- Commit to the free, family and community engagement model of coding exploration.
- 6 Commit to inviting everyone from the school/neighborhood to attend and intentionally reaching out to girls, students of color, and neurodiverse students.
- 7 Commit to flexibility—allowing students to explore in a self-directed way.
- Have access to a large space that you can divide out into "pods" or "stations" OR a combination of large and small spaces.
- Have access to wifi and devices (laptop, Chromebooks, iPad, etc.) for students who do not have their own. (Note: The Youth Code Jam can even be done without devices.)
- Recruit enough adult, student, or college volunteers (at least 1 volunteer for every 5 to 10 students). Consider volunteers who come from technology industries in your community.

Event Results:

- Kids and parents have fun, elbow-to-elbow learning together.
- **y** Volunteers are engaged and school stakeholders desire to host the event again.
- Survey data shows an improvement in student/family confidence and interest.
